History

Year 2000 – Founded and officially launched by the then Father Francis Sebastian in the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart of Jesus (SHC) – the first to be formed in the Southern District of Johor.

Under the guidance and training of Sr. Felicity, Christina Chong worked hard on the rules and policies of the Constitution.

First recruits : Magdalene Liang

Mary Fernandez Ignatius Wong

Funding was from the SHC Parish which was used for walk in and emergency cases.

Then, a big dream materialised when Bishop Emeritus James Chan launched the MJDOHD and every parishioner from every parish in the diocese was encouraged to contribute 10% of their monthly earnings. The money collected was dispensed to orphanages, old folks homes, charitable homes and Monfort School.

Vision & Mission

To carry out specific functions of POHD as stated in the Melaka-Johor Diocesan Office for Human Development Constitutions, especially in matters pertaining to the promotion of charity, integral human development and for justice and peace at parish level.

This includes providing financial relief to needy families, emergency aid, health aid and raise social awareness through education, formation programs and projects. POHD gets funding from MJDOHD and through efforts to raise funds at parish level.

Activities Of POHD SHC

Journey with FINS (Friends-in-need) -

- 1. Temporary Financial Aid to help families and single mothers.
- 2. Medical aid.
- 3. Home visits to families, providing friendship, comfort and support.
- 4. Feeding the Homeless & underprivileged at Downtown Streetside lunch and dinner.
- 5. Getting to know the FINS and family members and encouraging them to find their own source of fund by selling food and handy craft articles.
- 6. Going back to school project.
- 7. Chinese New Year and Christmas Ang Pao to needy children.
- 8. Helping FINS to apply for Kebajikan and other government assistance.

Pantry Project 2019

In 2019, POHD started the POHD Pantry Project wherein we reached out to parishioners and donors for groceries and monetary donations. At that time, we could never have imagined how far this Pantry Project would eventually go during the pandemic. We have a POHD mini market and groceries never stop flowing in and until today The Yayasan Sultan Ibrahim Johor still sends POHD groceries like rice, noodles, biscuits, sugar, salt, sauces, etc. We thank His Royal Highness Sultan Ibrahim for his great love for our Raykat Johor.







DURING MCO/CMCO/RMCO/NRP:

Besides helping our own FINs, we also helped locals, foreigners, migrants, squatters & our quarantine brothers & sisters with groceries, fresh produce, frozen food, bakery stuff, lunch and dinner boxes. We provided milk powder and diapers for children and elderlies in need together with wholesome food to adults with special health needs. Besides that, we also journeyed with migrant workers through their pregnancy.

We organised a lunch box station that provided about 100 lunch boxes every day at Taman Pelangi. People from the nearby housing areas register with us and come every day for the freshly cooked dinner boxes. Apart from that, we also maintained two Food Banks, filling them daily with rice, oil, vegetables, can food, etc for people to help themselves.

During the peak of the pandemic, we also often responded to the many urgent "white flag" call for help (a method used by many in urgent need of food by putting out a white flag outside their gates, door or windows to request for help from others during the pandemic).

Urgent financial aid were also often dispensed to meet medical needs, transport expenses for interstate travel, rentals, course fees and certification course required by jobs.

We also helped with job matching and also assistance for those needing Covid-19 vaccinations.

















Love from Christina Chong...

Through our work with the grassroots of the community, I observed much as could be summed up as follows:-

- 1. Many of us have busy lives. We are contented and absorbed in our own daily activities and often do not see those in need who live in the same community with us, much less understand their problems.
- 2. Those in need will always keep to themselves as they feel they are unable to keep up with the Joneses. They often have low self esteem and low morale.
- 3. Unless we go out to the grassroots and reach out to them, we will not be able to understand their predicament, lives and problems.
- 4. Single mothers are striving very hard to keep their families intact and listening to their stories made me realise that our marriage vows are of utmost importance. For better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health,...both husband and wife must strive to keep this vow. Many of the social problems we see stems from broken marriages.
- 5. Finally seeing many different real life situations make us realise how fortunate we are. It teaches us to value our lives and the lives of those around us.

Never regret a day in your life, good days give you happiness and bad days give you experience.

Happiness is found when you stop comparing yourself with people.

And my favourite is a quote by Richard Branson with a slight addition.

There is no greater thing you can do with your life and your work than follow your passions – in a way that serves Our God, the world and you.
